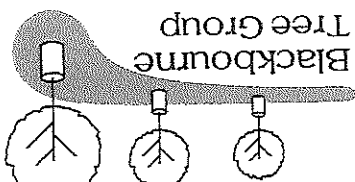


## Report to Honington and Sapiston Parish Council May 22



We had a couple of storms over the winter, resulting in fallen trees over the paths and we were fortunate to get Chris Holder and his team (with a wood chipper) to cut the huge diameter of elm into usable pieces. The pile of chips has all been used around the newly planted trees.

We had an excellent turn out to our first Work Day in April, when 14 of us planted 70 Jubilee trees at the river end of the field. Mark and I have watered these during the unseasonably dry April. We aim to have them all adopted by families on Jubilee Day, so hopefully some will survive with nurturing.

Another casualty was the "bus shelter" and David Pamplin kindly Organised replacement timber (already painted) from Jewsons and It has been repaired.

The paths have been mown by David Thrower and myself, we are grateful to the Parish Council for financial help with his work. Tim Shelly has been asked to cut the field and he has kindly suggested his "fee" be sent to Ukraine, which Sue Jay has done. Our regular monthly Work Day was well attended and we did more watering in the rain!
